

TODAY'S READINGS

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading — Amos said, "The LORD took me from following the flock, and said to me, Go, prophesy to my people" (Amos 7:12-15).

Psalm — Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation (Psalm 85).

Second Reading — The God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing (Ephesians 1:3-14 [3-10]).

Gospel — Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two (Mark 6:7-13).

The Call to Worship taken from a piece by John Goss (1800-1880), a professor at the Royal Academy of Music in London, among whose pupils was Arthur Sullivan of operetta fame. The text is: O savior of the world, who by your cross and precious blood has redeemed us.

The Offertory is from Isaiah 55:6, with music by Harrison Oxley (1940-2009): *Seek the Lord while he may be found; call upon him while he is near.*

The Communion begins with an Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) by Robert Morley (1557-1603), one of the leading composers of the English Renaissance. The most eminent pupil of the composer William Byrd, Morley took a degree from the University of Oxford in 1588. Later he became organist of Saint Paul's Cathedral and a musician in the royal chapel. After receiving the royal music-printing license formerly held by Byrd and the English composer Thomas Tallis, he wrote and edited madrigals, lute songs, and instrumental ensemble music. The most celebrated English music treatise of the period was his *Plaine and Easie Introduction to Practicall Musicke*.

The second piece is the motet Chantez a Dieu written in 1621 by the Dutch composer and organist Jan Pieterszoon Sweelinck (1562-1621) whose work straddled the end of the Renaissance and beginning of the Baroque eras. Many of his family were musicians, principally organists. By 1580 he was organist at the famous Oude Kerk in Amsterdam; his duties there were probably to provide an hour of music twice daily in the church. He became famous for his brilliant improvisations at the organ and harpsichord, which gave him the informal title of 'The Orpheus of Amsterdam'. He was also a skilled composer for voices, as this present piece demonstrates. As a teacher, Sweelinck was influential and sought after, and his pupils were among the most highly regarded musicians of the time. In later life he left Amsterdam only to inspect new organs and advise on repairs and restorations. The text of the piece is from Psalm 96: Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth. Sing to the Lord, bless his name; announce his salvation day after day.

The third piece is an Ave Maria by Theodore Dubois (1837-1924), who studied at the Paris Conservatoire before winning the Prix de Rome in 1861, a prestigious scholarship for arts students to study in that city created in 1663 during the reign of Louis XIV. Dubois became choirmaster at the Church of the Madeleine in Paris, and in 1871 took over from César Franck as choirmaster at the Basilica of Sainte-Clotilde before returning to the Madeleine. From 1871 he taught at the Paris Conservatoire, becoming Director in 1896 where he taught Paul Dukas, who composed The Sorcerer's Apprentice, which accompanied Mickey Mouse's magical woes in the movie Fantasia in 1940. Although an aspiring composer of opera, Dubois is remembered for only a handful of works today, especially The Seven Last Words of Christ.

The fourth piece is by the Irish composer Charles Wood (1886-1926), who was born in Armagh, Northern Ireland. His father was a tenor who sang in the choir of the nearby St. Patrick's Cathedral, where Charles became a chorister. Later, he travelled to London as one of fifty inaugural class members of the Royal College of Music. The text is from Psalm 145 and has often been used as a table prayer: The eyes of all look toward you, O Lord, and you give them meat in due season.



SAMARITANS CORNER




Samaritans is a group of charitable parishioners who take Holy Communion to the hospitalized and homebound, visit & help take meals to the sick and

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION



At the time of the Reformation, although England broke away from papal authority under Henry VIII, a silent majority clung to the Catholic faith. Henry's eldest daughter, Mary, restored the "old religion" in a fierce persecution of Protestants (she is

called "Bloody Mary" for good reason.) His youngest daughter, Elizabeth, rejected papal ties. Under her reign, beginning with legislation in 1593, Catholics were persecuted again, and only the very wealthy could afford the fines for not attending Anglican services on Sunday. They were called "recusants," from a Latin word meaning "refuse," since they refused to attend the liturgy of the Church of England. Many families maintained Catholic tradition in secret, and today their descendants claim "Recusancy" as a mark of family pride. For generations they sent their young people abroad to be educated in convents and monasteries. It is not surprising that the first monastery in colonial America springs from Holland with the daughters of patrician English recusant families. Port Tobacco, Maryland, proved fruitful soil for the Carmelite tradition. —Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.
