

TODAY'S READINGS

THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading — The widow of Zarephath had only a handful of flour and a little oil, but made a little cake for Elijah (1 Kings 17:10-16).

Psalm — Praise the Lord, my soul! (Psalm 146).

Second Reading — Christ will appear a second time to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him (Hebrews 9:24-28).

Gospel — This poor widow put in more than all the other contributors (Mark 12:38-44 [41-44]).

The Call to Worship is Gordon Young's setting of the Prayer of Richard of Chichester (1197-1253), who was canonized in 1262. A staunch advocate of clerical reform, Richard was elected Bishop of Chichester in 1244; his support of papal rights brought him into direct conflict with King Henry III and was consequently consecrated by Pope Innocent IV in Lyons, France the following year. On his return to England Henry confiscated the See's properties, only returning them two years later when threatened with excommunication. An ascetic who wore a hair-shirt and refused to eat off silver, Richard kept his diet simple and rigorously excluded meat. He was known to be merciless to usurers, corrupt clergy and priests who mumbled the Mass. The text is: Day by Day, Dear Lord of thee three things I pray: to see thee more clearly, love thee more dearly, follow thee more nearly, day by day. This musical setting is by American composer Gordon Young (1919-1998).

The Offertory is by Malcolm Archer: God be in my head, and in my understanding. God be in my eyes, and in my looking. God be in my mouth, and in my speaking; God be in my heart, and in my thinking; God be at my end, and at my departing.


The Communion begins with a motet by Francisco Guerrero (1528-1599) who was appointed music director at Jaén Cathedral in Andalusia, the autonomous community in Southern Spain., at the age of 17. He later accepted a similar position in the capital, Seville. In 1589 he traveled to the Holy Land, but coming home his ship was twice attacked by pirates, who threatened his life, stole his money, and held him for ransom. Back in Spain, a series of misfortunes led him to debtor's prison; at last his old employer at Seville Cathedral extricated him, and he resumed working there. His book on his adventurous vacation was published in 1590; he intended to return but unfortunately died in the plague of 1599 in Seville. The text is: Lord Jesus Christ, I worship you, who was wounded on the cross and given gall and vinegar to drink: I pray that your wounds may be a remedy for my soul.

The second piece is the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy) from the *Solemn Mass in Honor of Saint Cecilia*, the patroness saint of music, by French composer Charles Gounod.

The third piece is a short motet by Jean Berger (1909-2002) who was born Arthur Schlossberg in Hamm, Westphalia, and grew up in Alsace-Lorraine. He studied composition in Paris, and while working as assistant conductor at an opera house in Mannheim was forcibly removed from a rehearsal by the Brownshirts. After the Nazis seized power in 1933 he moved to Paris, where he took the French name Jean Berger, and toured widely as a pianist and accompanist. From 1939 to 1941, he was assistant conductor at the Municipal Theater in Rio de Janeiro and on the faculty of the Brazilian Conservatory of Music. 1941 found him serving in the U.S. Army, becoming a citizen in 1943. He worked at the Office of War Information producing foreign-language broadcasts and USO shows until 1946 begore working as a music arranger for CBS and NBC and touring the as a concert accompanist before taking up faculty positions at various universities. In retirement, he lectured throughout the world on aspects of American music. This text is from an 1825 book plate by the Pennsylvania Dutch writer Maria Brubacher: A rose touched by the sun's warm rays all its petals doth unfold; So you, when touched by God's great mercy, Let joy and gladness win your soul.

Veterans Day "Honoring All Who Served"

On the eleventh hour of the eleventh day in the eleventh month of the year 1918, an armistice was signed, ending World War I, which was described at the time as "the war to end all wars." Thereafter, November 11th was set aside as "Armistice Day" in the United States to remember the sacrifices that men and women made during World War I in order to ensure a lasting peace.



In 1938, Congress voted "Armistice Day" as a legal holiday, but World War II began the following year. American effort during World War II saw the greatest mobilization of the U.S. Army, Navy, Marines and Air Force in the nation's history (more than 16 million people); some 5.7 million more served in the Korean War.

"Armistice Day" was still observed after the end of the Second World War, until 1954, when after lobbying efforts by veterans' service organizations, the 83rd U.S. Congress amended the 1938 act that had made "Armistice Day" a holiday, striking the word "Armistice" in favor of "Veterans." President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed the legislation on June 1, 1954. From then on, November 11th became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

The next development in the story of "Veterans Day" unfolded in 1968, when Congress passed the Uniform Holidays Bill, which sought to ensure three-day weekends for federal employees—and encourage tourism and travel—by celebrating four national holidays (Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Veterans Day and Columbus Day) on Mondays.

The observance of "Veterans Day" was set on the fourth Monday in October. The first "Veterans Day" under the new law was Monday, October 25, 1971. Confusion ensued, as many states disapproved of this change, and continued to observe the holiday on its original date.

In 1975, after it became evident that the actual date of "Veterans Day" carried historical and patriotic significance to many Americans, President Gerald Ford signed a new law returning the observance of "Veterans Day" to November 11th beginning in 1978. If November 11th falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the federal government observes the holiday on the previous Friday or following Monday, respectively.

This weekend, we remember with gratitude all those who have served our country in the armed forces. As we do, let us keep them always in our prayers.

Prayer for Veterans

Help us, dear God, to see your face in every veteran we encounter. Guide us as we imagine new ways to support Veterans and their families. Bring healing and peace to all who have been wounded physically, mentally and spiritually during wartime. Help us bring your saving grace to heal the invisible wounds of war. We ask this in Jesus' holy name. Amen.



THE CALL TO DISCIPLESHIP



The core vocation in the Gospel of Mark is the vocation, or call, to discipleship. Today's Gospel passage provides us with one last example of what the vocation to discipleship means, and one example of what it doesn't mean. A destitute widow

shows us that discipleship means following Jesus' way of service, even if it requires giving one's livelihood (or life). The scribes show us by their bad example that discipleship should entail a vocation to extend God's care to those who are most in need.

In our reading from the book of Kings another widow and her son are close to death. They too give what little they have, but they are rewarded by Elijah with food enough for a year. And the reading from the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that Jesus sacrificed his life "to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him" (Hebrews 9:28).
