

TODAY'S READINGS

FOUND AS THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST IN THE COMPANION MISSAL

First Reading — Never forget the LORD your God, who brought you out of slavery and fed you with manna in the desert (Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a).

Psalm — Praise the Lord, Jerusalem (Psalm 147).

Second Reading — Because the loaf of bread is one, we who partake of it, though we are many, are one body (1 Corinthians 10:16-17).

Gospel — Jesus said to the crowds, "I am the living bread; whoever eats this bread will live forever" (John 6:51-58).

The Call to Worship is the plainsong hymn Adoro te devote, attributed to Saint Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274), to honor Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament at Pope Urban IV's (1261-1264) request when he first established the Feast of Corpus Christi in 1264. The hymn is found in the Roman Missal as a prayer of thanksgiving after Mass. Many poetic translations begin 'Humbly I adore you, verity unseen' but a closer literal translation is: I devoutly adore you, O God truly hidden beneath these appearances. My whole heart submits to you, and in contemplating you, it surrenders itself completely

The Offertory is by Alan Viner (born 1951) with words from a hymn by the Scottish hymn writer Horatius Bonar (1808 -89): Here, O my Lord, I see thee face to face, here will I touch and handle things unseen; here grasp with firmer hand the eternal grace, and all my weariness upon thee lean.

The Communion begins with a traditional prayer honoring the Blessed Sacrament written by Saint Thomas Aquinas, expressing the profound mystery of the Eucharistic miracle: O sacred banquet, in which Christ is received, the memory of his passion is renewed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory given to us. Saint Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274, Aguinas meaning 'of Aguino' in west central Lazio region of Italy, rather than his family name) was an immensely influential philosopher and theologian, the foremost classical proponent of natural theology who had considerable influence on Western thought. Much of modern philosophy was conceived as a reaction against, or as an agreement with, his ideas, particularly in the areas of ethics, natural law and political theory. One of the 33 Doctors of the Church, he is considered by many of our faith to be the Church's greatest theologian and philosopher. This musical setting is by Malcolm Archer, former Director of Music at St. Paul's Cathedral in London.

The second piece at 7:30 and 9 is *Panis angelicus* (Bread of Angels) by Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina (1525-1594), a giant among the native 16th Century Italian musicians, none of whom were more skilled in realizing the functional and aesthetic aims of Catholic church music in the age of the Counter-Reformation. Palestrina began his career as a boy chorister in the church of Santa Maria Maggiore in Rome, a city to which he returned in 1551 as Maestro of the Julian Choir at St. Peter's. He was a member of the Sistine Choir but was required to drop out when he married in 1555, and in the same year became music director at the church of St. John Lateran. The text translates: *Therefore, angels' bread is made the bread of man: the living bread from heaven. O wondrous gift indeed! The poor and lowly may feed upon their Lord and master.*

The second piece at 10:30 is *Panis angelicus* by the Belgian composer César Franck (1822-1920) who was organist at the basilica church of St. Clotilde in Paris for over forty years.

The third piece is by John Rutter (b. 1945): The Lord bless you and keep you, the Lord make his face to shine upon you, and be gracious unto you. The Lord lift up the light of his countenance upon you and give you peace, Amen.

Congratulations to Our First Communicants!

It has been the tradition here at the Church of the Nativity to celebrate First Holy Communion on the Saturday morning before the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*). This weekend we congratulate all of our young parishioners who received First Communion on Saturday, June 17th, as well as those who have received First Communion during other Lord's Day Masses during the Easter Season.

During a special meeting that I recently had with the second grade class of The Nativity School, the students gave me letters telling me how they had prepared for First Communion and why this was such a special day for them. Here are some of their answers:



I have prepared by:

Speaking to Jesus more. And by telling God all about my love for Him;

Showing my love for others through my actions and trying to stay free of sin;

Learning the Ten Commandments;

Practicing at home and learning the parts of the Mass;

Practicing being respectful and by studying in class:

Prayers at home and trying not to sin;

Trying to be more honest and by behaving at Mass;

Praying the rosary every night; I also am acting more like Jesus:

Trying not to lie and putting more love into my heart:

Showing my love for Jesus through my actions; Practicing my faith, going to confession and praying the rosary;

Going to Mass, learning the parts of the Mass, following the Ten Commandments and Jesus' example.


